Financial awards in the Faculty of Physical Education and Health are available for students registered in the Faculty's degree programs as well as students from other faculties engaged in university athletics.

The Faculty is pleased to offer an online application system, which we hope will make the process easier for students.

The Office of Admissions and Awards and the Faculty's Awards Committee select the recipients from the online applications, statements of interest, academic results, and nominations they receive. Many of the awards were specifically created to meet the requirements of students who demonstrate financial need.

Financial assistance is available to entering students engaged in intercollegiate sports with an average of at least 80%, based on those courses used to determine admission. All financial awards for student-athletes are available to a maximum value of \$3,500 annually. For more details on available awards and applications please contact the head coach of your respective team.

Both the Faculty of Physical Education and Health and the University of Toronto have made student financial assistance the highest priority. Last year, the Faculty made more than \$338,500 available for student scholarships and financial aid. It is through the ongoing generosity of our alumni and friends that the Faculty of Physical Education and Health is able to continue our commitment to excellence in academics, athletics and leadership.

I invite you to take advantage of the opportunities that these financial awards may offer. We intend to make the decisions by the end of June 2010, thus enabling the recipients to budget more effectively for the 2010-11 academic year.

Application Procedure

Unless otherwise specified, the deadline for award applications is **April 9th, 2010**, and only online applications will be accepted. The online application can be found at:

www.physical.utoronto.ca/alumni/awards/index.php

The successful candidates will be notified by mail to a summer address after grades have been released. Where 'financial need' is a criterion, award payment will only be deposited after the award winner has submitted their proof of OSAP to Awards Officer, Tade Credgeur. These awards are tenable in the 2010-11 academic year (i.e. September 2010 to May 2011).

All successful candidates are strongly encouraged to write a note of thanks to the award donor(s).

Definition of Terms

Financial Need

If the award criterion includes a financial need component, the primary assessment of need is OSAP eligibility. A copy of your "Notice of Assessment" or "OSAP Entitlement" from the OSAP website (<http://osap.gov.on.ca>) must be provided to the Faculty's Awards Officer, tade.credgeur@utoronto.ca before **September 17, 2010** in order to confirm award eligibility and receive payment.

Academic Terms

All awards require continuing students to have at least a "B" average, or annual GPA of 2.50 and above. If a criterion indicates '**Academic Excellence**', an "A" average, or annual GPA of 3.50 and above is required.

Athletic Financial Awards

While some awards give preference to candidates from a specific Varsity Blues team, such awards shall be open to candidates in other intercollegiate sports or programs if there is no clear recipient in the program specified.

Any award related to participation in Varsity sports falls under Ontario University Athletics (OUA) and Canadian Interuniversity Sport (CIS) regulations. A maximum award total per calendar year is \$3,500. This information can also be found at: www.oua.ca or www.cis-sic.ca.

Stipulations for **continuing student-athletes** include: having a "B" average; taking a minimum of three full courses within the academic year, or the required course load to meet OUA and CIS requirements; having completed two academic terms at U of T; and returning as a student-athlete.

Prospective student-athletes are encouraged to speak to the coach of their respective team about the available financial awards. Criteria are similar to continuing student-athletes, however, a minimum entering grade average of 80%, on those courses used to determine your university admission, is required.

Admission Scholarships

Please consult the undergraduate calendar for detailed descriptions and apply by submission of a Statement of Interest. Where financial need is a criterion, submission of a UTAPs application and OSAP eligibility are considered. Award recipients are notified upon admission to the program.

DALT AND MARNIE WHITE AWARD..... \$1000

Awarded to a student on the basis of:

- Demonstrated participation in school activities
- Demonstrated leadership in the organization and support of athletics

DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIP (3) \$1500

To be awarded to a secondary school student, entering 1st year BPHE program with an average of 90% or better, and who has not received any other admission scholarship.

DR. DONALD H.H. MACKENZIE BPHE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP \$4700

To be awarded to a candidate entering first year on the basis of:

- Financial need
- Excellence as determined by admission average, a commitment to a lifestyle of physical activity as a means of maintaining health, and leadership experience in some aspect of the broad field of physical and health education.

JEAN FORSTER ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS (2)..... \$3000

To be awarded to candidates entering first year on the basis of:

- Academic merit in the secondary school program
- An outstanding Statement of Interest
- The recipient's minimum overall admissions average in Ontario Grade 12U/OAC or their graduating year of secondary school must be a minimum of 88%. A candidate whose average falls below 88% may be awarded at the discretion of the Dean of the Faculty of Physical Education and Health.

PRESIDENT'S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (2)..... \$2000

Canadian citizens or permanent residents enrolled at the UofT in the fall. This award is available to all; studying at a secondary school or CEGEP in Canada; have completed each of the courses required for admissions, including prerequisites, with 'A' standing; and admission average is 92% or better.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I apply? Online at: www.physical.utoronto.ca/alumni/awards/index.php

What information do I need to fill out the application? You will be asked for:

- student number
- social insurance number
- mailing address
- sentences outlining your athletic, academic, and leadership achievements at U of T. This information is very important! It is used by the award selection committee, in the award ceremony, and in the letter to the award donor.

I don't qualify for OSAP, should I still apply?

YES. There are several awards that do not require OSAP eligibility.

I don't know if I qualify for OSAP, what should I do?

Apply for OSAP at <http://osap.gov.on.ca>, and on the OSAP section of your award application form indicate that you will apply for OSAP. If it turns out you qualify for OSAP, you do not have to accept the loan; we just need to know that you are eligible.

How do I know if I am eligible for Athletic Scholarships and Awards?

You must be registered as a U of T student-athlete in 2010-11 academic year. And, you must be registered in a minimum of 3 full courses within the academic year, or the required course load to meet Ontario University Athletics (OUA) and Canadian Interuniversity Sport (CIS) requirements. **Entering student-athletes** are required to have a minimum entering grade average of 80, on those courses used to determine university admission. **Continuing student-athletes** should have completed at least two academic terms at U of T by May 2010, and have an annual GPA of at least 2.50 ("B") in 2009-10 (unless noted otherwise).

Who makes the decisions on who gets the awards?

Admissions and Awards as well as the Faculty Awards Committee make the decision based on your online application, academics, statement of interest, and by nomination. The Award Committee has representatives who are FPEH professors, FPEH staff/coaches, students, alumni and a university representative from the Office of Admission and Awards.

When do I find out if I get an award?

The majority of decisions will be made by the end of June, but some awards will not be announced until September. Only successful applicants will be contacted with a letter in the mail, so please make sure your address is correct!

When do the awards get paid?

The awards are paid in the fall term of 2010-11, after your registration status, and OSAP eligibility (if needed) are confirmed. For **athletic scholarships**, payments are made once you have submitted your eligibility form to the Intercollegiate Office at the Athletic Centre. Eligibility forms for co-curricular sports are currently available in the Intercollegiate Office, or in the "Athletes Only" section of the www.varsityblues.ca website. Login information can be obtained from your coach.

Do I get a cheque?

The award payment is made to your student account. In accordance with the UofT policy on student awards, any outstanding fees will be deducted from the award amount, and the balance is mailed to you by cheque from the Student Accounts Office. For **athletic scholarships**, the awarded amount will be deposited directly into your student account in two equal installments, one per academic semester, to cover your tuition and fees. If you pay your total outstanding balance prior to the award being deposited, a refund will be mailed to your sessional address. Otherwise, show your offer letter to your Registrar for payment deferral until the awarding amount has been deposited.
